

PART ONE: DRAW A LINE FROM EACH UNDERLINED NOUN TO A MATCHING PICTURE.

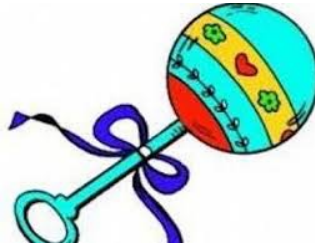
